18,026 spay/neuter surgeries were performed, compared to 16,489 the previous year.

9,987 adoptions and about 70% were from local sources. Animals in our adoption program have as long as it takes to find a new home.

2,962 dogs & cats were adopted as "special needs" because of medical or behavioral issues.

1,299 animals transferred from MADACC for adoption at WHS, a record in at least the last decade.

4,848 wild animals were admitted to the Wildlife Rehabilitation Center.

7,653 children were reached through youth programming.

2,757 clients served through our Pets for Life program, and 1,061 animals were spayed/neutered.

1,048 animals were reunited with their families.

34,730 individuals were inspired to make a donation to support the animals at WHS.

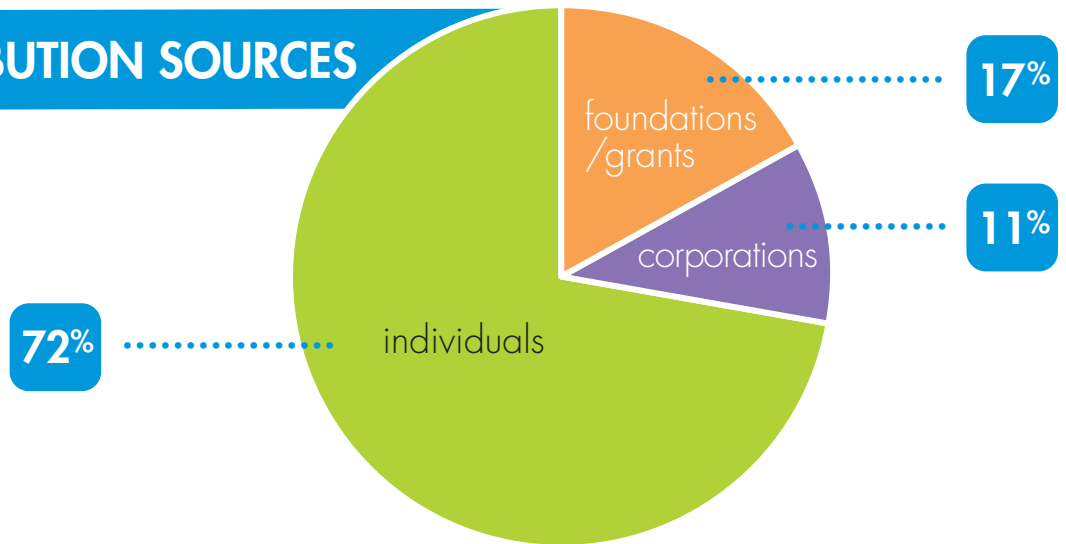
\$1.5 million in gifts were received through Buster's Legacy donors who supported animals through estate plans.

8,835 individuals made their very first contribution to us, representing \$1,117,738.35 in new revenue.

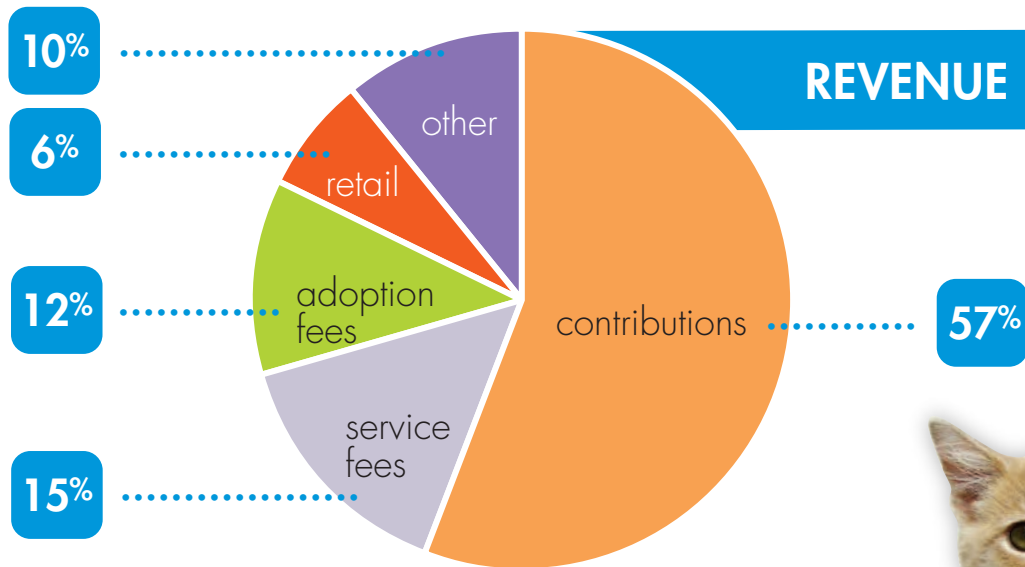
137 people contributed an amazing \$743,054.02 to our capital campaign for the Racine Campus.
